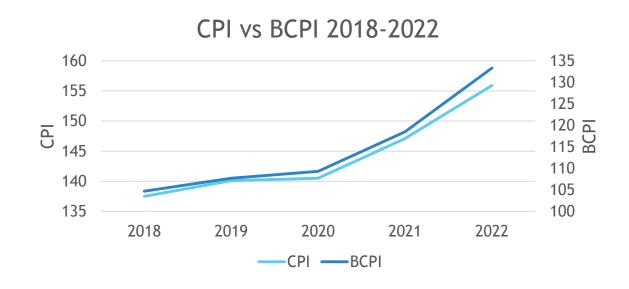

Budget Impacts - Economic Indicators

- Consumer price index has been increasing over the past two years, putting additional pressures on households and the Township.
- Non-residential building construction price index has also risen considerably. This places additional pressures on the township to increase taxes in order to pay for services and build additional infrastructure.





Budget Impacts - Interest Rates

- Interest rates have increased significantly over the past year, as illustrated in the table below
- Interest rate increases will result in increased investment revenues to be recycled through the Township to combat pricing increases as a result of CPI and BCPI increases

Budget Impacts - Council Approved Service Levels

 - Development Charges By-Law Study
 - Development Services Review and Fee Study
- Other staff proposed options may also impact the budget:
 - In-house or outsourcing, business process design and technology modernization



Budget Impacts - Funding Strategies

 - Fee recovery 3% increase for 2023, indexed to inflation for 2024 and the future
 - Free Use and Community User Group Grants policy to be reviewed in 2023 for 2024 implementation
- Grants allocation policy for amounts received from upper levels of government
- Investment Strategies review investment policy update in 2023
- Debt Management 2023 includes pay back of Fire Station, 2024 potential debt for Sunderland Arena Project
- Reserve and Reserve Fund Policies contributions to capital infrastructure reserves, use of tax rate stabilization reserves
- Property Taxation rates

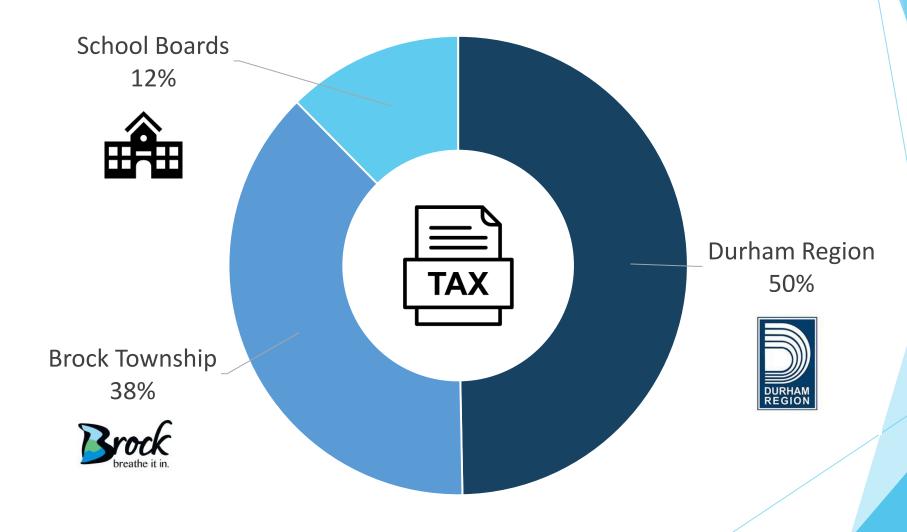

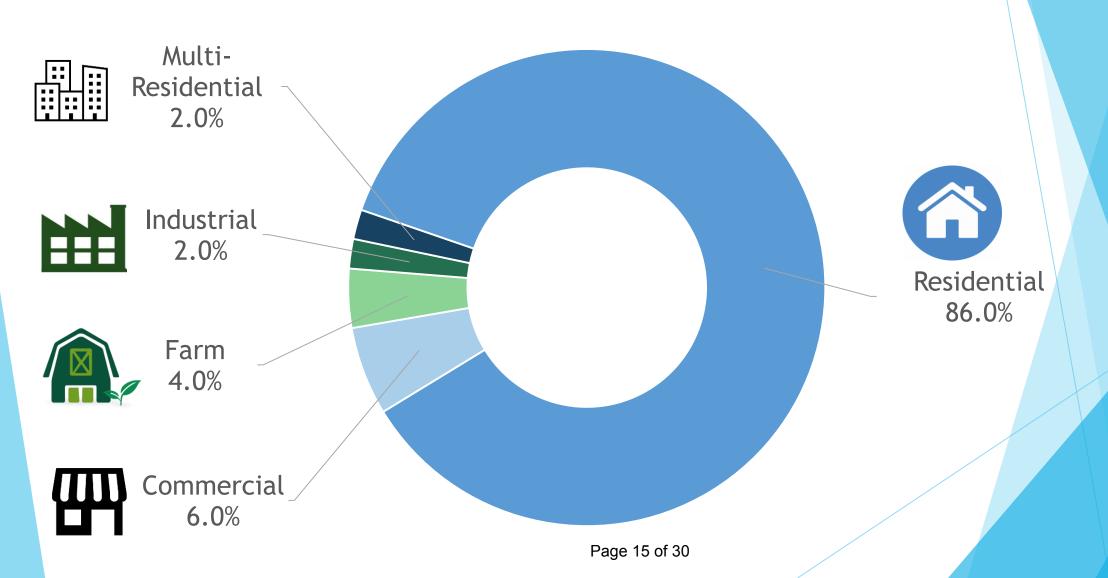


2022 Township of Brock - Property Tax Distribution

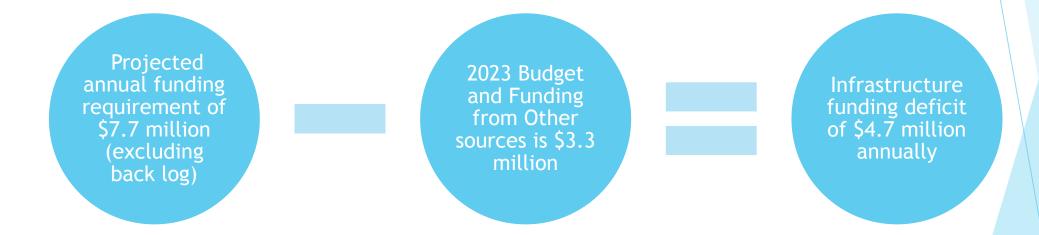

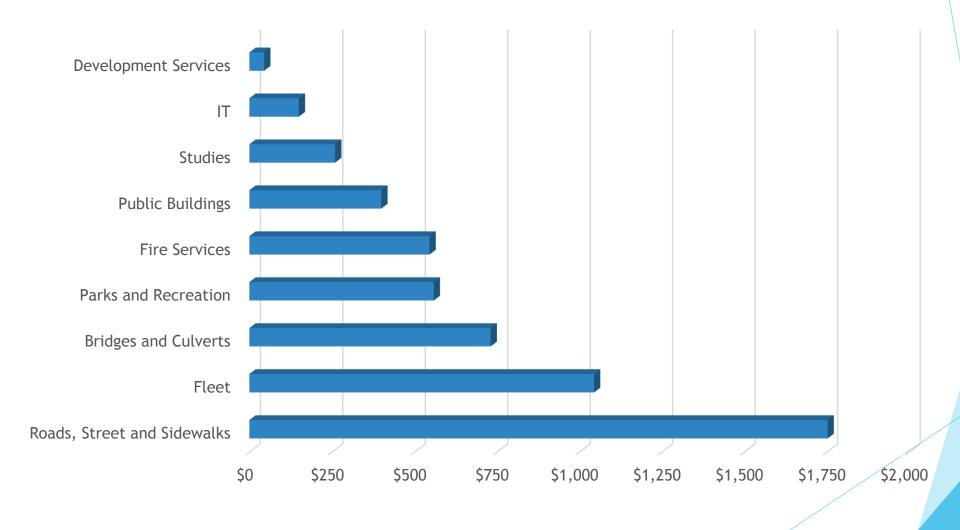
Projected Asset Renewal Value estimated at \$335.2 million (2019) - future asset management funding policy discussion

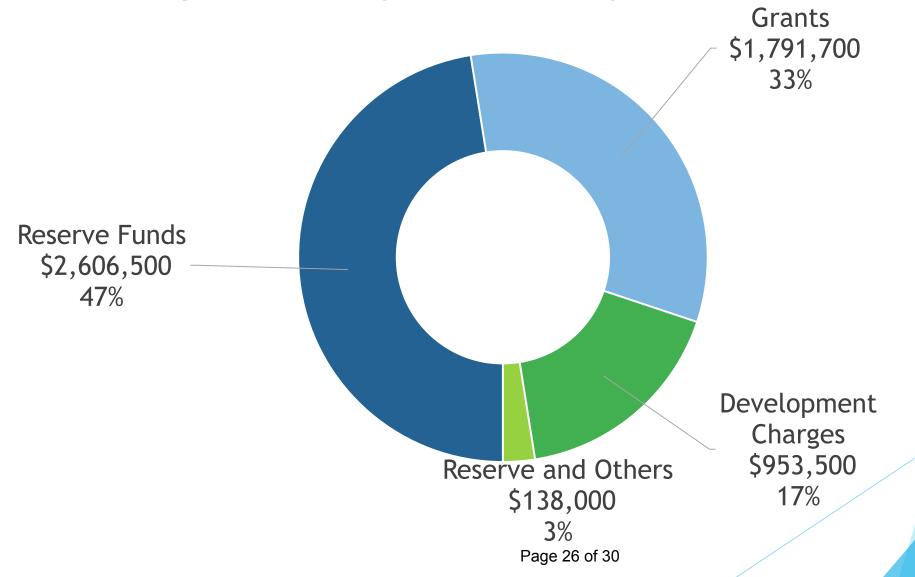

THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF BROCK

BY-LAW NUMBER 3169-2023

A BY-LAW TO CONFIRM THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF BROCK AT ITS MEETING HELD ON FEBRUARY 13, 2023

WHEREAS section 5 of the *Municipal Act*, S.O. 2001, and its amendments provides that the powers of a municipal corporation shall be exercised by its council;

AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient that the proceedings of the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Brock at the meeting named in the title of this by-law be confirmed and adopted by by-law;

THEREFORE BE IT ENACTED by the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Brock as follows:

- 1. The action of the Council of the said Corporation at its meeting held on the 13th day of February 2023, in respect of each recommendation contained in the reports of the committees and each motion and resolution passed and other action taken by Council of the said Corporation at this meeting is hereby adopted and confirmed as if all such proceedings were expressly embodied in this by-law.
- 2. The Mayor and proper officials of the said Corporation are hereby authorized and directed to do all things necessary to give effect to the action of the said Council referred to in the preceding section hereof.
- 3. The Mayor and Clerk are authorized and directed to execute all documents necessary in that behalf and to affix the Corporate Seal of the Township of Brock thereto.
