Subject: MacLeod Park picnic shelter

The Cannington Lions Club is proud to present to Council 573 signatures on a local petition asking that The Township of Brock restore the picnic shelter on the North side of MacLeod Park.

As previously requested and stated from our Club in correspondence of January 2023 this picnic shelter was a valued asset in MacLeod Park. The shelter was constructed through fundraising and volunteer efforts of The Cannington Lions Club. While our Club did not appreciate the structure being removed without consultation we do understand the issue of safety which must take priority and we thank Township staff for their concerns but even communication regarding maintenance issues would have been appreciated.

The North picnic shelter is unique and very much unlike the shelter constructed on the South side of the park. The South shelter was never designed to take the place of the North shelter. Further, the South shelter lacks much of the amenities of the North shelter such as adjacent tree shade, view of The Beaver River, accessible base, and an accessible access. The North shelter has been used by families, individuals, and local organizations to name a few.

This past year The Township of Brock has spent many thousands of dollars fixing the window at the historic Sunderland Town Hall and money on replacing an electronic sign in Beaverton that was only about a year old. We are simply asking that an important part of Cannington park infrastructure be replaced and given similar attention.

The Cannington Lions Club, on behalf of the residents of Cannington, are hereby requesting that a replacement shelter be constructed in the coming months and that an item be included in the 2024 township budget. While The Cannington Lions Club does not have the resources of other township service organizations we are willing to financially contribute to replacement of the shelter and welcome the opportunity to discuss the process of replacement.
