Mandate and Responsibilities

With staff support the committee will;

Coordinate representation from a wide variety of tourism stakeholders, and municipal and regional staff, who have a vested interest in furthering tourism development and creating tourism-focused strategic goals for the Township of Brock.

Increase awareness of the economic and social benefits of tourism and support an enhanced collaboration between industry and government.

Continue to implement tourism action items as identified in the Township of Brock Community Tourism Strategy, completed in partnership with Central Counties Tourism in 2019.

Improve the quality, quantity and sharing of tourism data and strengthen performance measurement and the tracking of visitors for tourism related events.

Continue to collaborate with local organizations and groups including the Brock Board of Trade, historical societies, arts organizations, Non-Profit Sector Advisory Committee, and sport clubs to help further increase tourism awareness.

Identify and advise on issues, concerns and government policies that may affect the tourism industry.

Continue to work on the Council approved work plan.











Background

Council appointed the Brock Tourism Advisory Committee in January 2021. Following the Municipal Election in the Fall of 2022, the current BTAC committee was appointed in the Spring of 2023 and commenced meetings in Fall 2023.

The committee will continue to work toward goals indicated on the BTAC Workplan that was developed by the 2021 BTAC Committee. The 2021 Workplan was developed to consider action items outlined in the Brock Community Tourism Plan as well as the Brock Business Retention and Expansion study.

Recommendations



	Initiative	Description	Committee Actions to Achieve Initiative
1	Marketing and Promotion to support BTAC initiatives	Request for additional funding	Allocate an additional \$5000 in BTAC 2025 budget for marking and promotion to support work plan initiatives
2	Ontario by Bike Campaign	Advocate and build awareness of the Ontario By Bike certification program for Brock tourism businesses.	incentivize businesses to become certified and provide them with a bike safety kit (purchased by Durham Tourism) ensure newly certified businesses fall within a Durham Tourism on-road cycling loop
3	Bike repair stations	Funding request and direction from Director of Parks, Recreation and Facilities on purchasing bike repair stations	Additional Bike repair stations to be located in Sunderland and Cannington. Consult with the Director of Parks, Recreation and Facilities specifics of project in 2025
4	Overnight Parking and accommodations	Alleviate some of the issues regarding lack of overnight accommodations	Amend the work plan to consider overnight accommodation, by reviewing the existing governing bylaws/policies and researching possible option from other municipalities
