My name is Stephanie. I am one of the full-time nurses that care for Melissa and Joe's son, Jackson. I work day and night shifts with the family. On more than one occasion I have had frightful interactions with the neighbour's dogs next door. The dogs are let out early in the morning (sometimes unsupervised), and I often have to run from the front door just to get to my car safely. There have been times when I have almost tumbled down the steps due to fear of the dogs crossing the yard. They bark very aggressively, and are very intimidating. Prior to Joe installing the fence in the backyard, I would be fearful of taking Jackson outside to play. We have had to run inside many times for fear that the dogs would hop the fence and attack. They growl, bark, and cross the front yard quite a bit before the leash stops them. I'm not sure about what should be done, however, I do know some sort of action needs to be taken soon before someone is harmed by those dogs.
