

THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF BROCK

BY-LAW NUMBER 3409-2026

Being A By-law to Appoint a Lottery Licencing Officer and to Establish Lottery Licence Fees to Manage Lottery Schemes for Charitable or Religious Purposes

WHEREAS Section 207 of the Criminal Code of Canada empowers an authority in the Province to issue a license that contains such terms and conditions relating to the management and conduct of lottery schemes to which the license relates as the said authority may prescribe; and

Whereas Section 5 of the *Municipal Act*, S.O. 2001, as amended, states that powers of a municipality shall be exercised by its Council; and

Whereas Section 9 of the *Municipal Act*, S.O. 2001, as amended, states that by-laws and resolutions of a municipality apply within its boundaries; and

Whereas the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Brock desires to appoint a Lottery Licencing Officer pursuant to Order-in-Council 208/2024, as amended, to license charitable or religious organizations to conduct and manage lottery schemes for charitable or religious purposes;

Now Therefore the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Brock enacts as follows:

1. That a "Lottery Licensing Officer" shall include the Township Clerk, and any other person(s) who may from time to time be authorized or delegated the authority to issue licenses for the Corporation of the Township of Brock and shall exercise all the authority, powers and perform all the duties and obligations as outlined in the regulatory framework through the Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario; and
2. That Schedule of Lottery Licence Fees shall be 3% of the total prize board or as amended by the Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario; and
3. That By-law Number 2848-2019-AP be and the same is hereby repealed in its entirety; and
4. That this by-law shall come into force and effect on the date of its passage.
