5.1 Item 7.3 Parking Provisions Zoning By-law Amendment

Communication No. 1337/21

Mark Jacobs, Biglieri Group, advised that he is the planner for Beaverton Mara Inc. who have submitted a draft plan of residential subdivision and rezoning applications for lands located on Main Street, Beaverton. He advised that, while generally in support of the amendments to the Zoning By-law with respect to parking provisions, he has the following concerns:

- the blanket requirement for visitor parking for all dwelling types which equates to three parking spaces for any freehold lots with frontage on a public road
- is unaware of other jurisdictions in Ontario requiring visitor parking on freehold lots like this
- requirements for visitor parking for townhouse type construction is generally on the same land owned by a condominium corporation and not on public streets
- Beaverton townhouse complexes on private roads provide for visitor parking within that condominium block
- small single lot and semi-detached homes would be discouraged as they could not accommodate the required 3 parking spaces
- this is contrary to the Township's Official Plan which encourages a
  wide variety of housing types/intensification to satisfy the social
  economic needs of existing and future residents
