5. Public Meetings

5.1 Explanatory Note - 112 River Street, Sunderland - 09-2022-RA Bowness

The purpose of this Statutory Public meeting, pursuant to the Planning Act R.S.O. 1990, is to inform the public of the details of an application to amend Zoning By-law Number 287-78-PL to rezone the subject land from General Commercial (C1) Zone to General Commercial Exception (C1-X) Zone to permit the development of four (4) residential units on the ground floor of an existing building located at 112 River Street, Sunderland and to provide relief for on-site parking requirements. This meeting is to provide an opportunity for the public to make comments on the proposed applications. Members of Council were in attendance to observe and listen to comments.

If a person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the Township of Brock before the by-law is enacted (if approved), the person or public body is NOT entitled to appeal the decision of the Council of the Township of Brock to the Ontario Land Tribunal.

Further, the person or public body may NOT be added as a party to the hearing of an appeal before the Ontario Land Tribunal unless, in the opinion of the Tribunal, there are reasonable grounds to do so.

There will be no decision made on behalf of the Township of Brock in respect of the applications at this meeting.

The Council of the Township of Brock will consider the merits of these

applications at a later date, taking into consideration all input received on the subject applications.

In the event that the rezoning by-law is enacted by Council, it will be circulated in the formal manner under the provisions of the Planning Act, including those identified as interested parties. At that time, if objections are received, a hearing will be held before the Ontario Land Tribunal, at which time the objectors will be informed of a hearing date.

5.1.1 Staff Presentation / Overview

The Planner provided the following comments:

- location of application is 112 River Street at corner of River and Church Streets, Sunderland
- operated as residential property through Durham Region Non Profit Housing Corporation with Council permission
- DRNPHC sold the property which now requires rezoning to permit residential use of the building
- recognize the parking deficiency

5.1.2 Consultant / Application Presentation

The consultants for the applicant are Ed Starr and Andrew Vrana, SHS Consulting.

Andrew Vrana provided the following comments:

- Site location is northeast corner of Church Street and River Street, Sunderland, Township of Brock
- the site is 500 square metres and represents 10% of apartment units in Sunderland
- historical residential uses a bank with residential units above
- Durham Non Profit Housing facility 'St. Andrew's Place' Zoning By-law provision allowed residential use without rezoning subject to their needs
- proposed rezoning to continue residential use on the ground floor
- renovations at 112 River Street, Sunderland

- parking supply 3 spaces currently exist investigating additional parking spaces
- community benefits retains rental housing supply in Sunderland; corrects the zoning; C1-X zoning will continue to allow for future commercial use

The applicants, Anna and Jonathan Bowness, provided the following comments:

- have experience renting properties
- residents of Port Perry
- renovating the existing apartments themselves
- many renters have expressed interest in renting
- local Sunderland residents are on the rental wait list
